E-Waste or electronic waste is anything that plugs in that is no longer used such as old televisions, computers, monitors, telephones, radios, cell phones, iPods, or printers. Some of these devices contain some materials like mercury, lead, cadmium and PCBs that can pollute water and air resources without proper disposal or recycling. Electronics also contain valuable metals and components that can be used again in another manufacturing

process.

On June 9 REWIND (Recycle E-Waste Into New Devices) encourages you to bring all of your E-Waste from your attic to your cellar and from the barn to the coulee down to the Visitors Center between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. The first 50 lbs. in each vehicle is free. The Lions Club will be serving up some mighty fine free hot dogs, and there will be tables for you to look at to get more information about what is happening in our community.
